

Coordinate with partners to promote increased efficiency and impact for partners and investors, serve as critical link between employers and early education programs, facilitate innovative approaches within the private sector.



2023 - 2024 Partnerships Sites

  - 20 scholarships for low-income working families
- Olathe Open Minds Infant Toddler Center
  - 10 infant toddler scholarships in Olathe for working families.
- Olathe KidZone Wesleyan Church
  - 15 scholarships for immigrant families seeking employment
- Overland Park KidZone, Wesleyan Church
  - 20 scholarships for low-income working families
- KCMO Operation Breakthrough
  - 15 scholarships to quality PreK for low-income working families

#### Past Partners

- 2019 **Wyandotte County**, Educare, 60 **s**cholarships
- 2020 **Wyandotte County**, El Centro Academy for Children, 30 scholarships

#### Partner Criteria

- 1. 0-5 year enrollment meets "at risk" eligibility
- 2. Organization uses evidence-based tools to assess developmental milestones
- 3. Organization is committed to offering full-day, full-year early childhood services for working families.


Collect data from partners to measure impact and continuously improve.

#### Impact. Developmental Gains - 39%

- Entrance Baseline Average: 16% Proficient upon fall enrollment in preschool program.
- Exit Population Proficiency: 55% Kindergarten Ready.

Parent U meets the **personal and professional development** needs and interests of the parents of SOCI scholarship recipients. All parents at partner sites are invited to attend





#### Impact:

Improve the lives and livelihoods of both the parents and children, now and in the future – a multi-generational shift

#### We are interested in:

- Co-creating learning experiences with our partner sites tailored to the goals set by families
- Offering bi-annual half-day workshops on Saturdays, with childcare to maximize participation and connection
- Working with experts from the community to teach and facilitate learning and development

#### **SOCI is a Community Champion for Expansion**

#### **Expansion Funding. \$1,350,000 State Award**

- \$847,0670 Open Minds Child Development Center (Olathe Infant/Toddler Center)
- \$490,528 KidZone Learning Center (Overland Park new EC center/community services)

Impact: Allocation of resources allow access for an additional 130 children to attend full-day full-year early childhood centers.

#### We are interested in:

- Building projects to establish and sustain high quality early childhood programs.
- Advocating for early education centers to expand access to underserved populations.
- Building new centers to increase access to quality early childhood education for working families.

<u>INVEST</u>: Leverage funding and influence from private and public sectors to increase access to high performing early childhood centers supporting working families.

# With an investment of \$25,000, we will see:

- Expansion to eight partner sites across Kansas and Missouri in 2024.
- 85% of children in SOCI partner sites meeting developmental milestones.
- Expansion of access for children to attend full-day full-year early childhood services.
